
ACTIVITY SHEET NO. 2





Its because of TRAITS. I did a lot of research on this and gathered some information. A trait is a specific characteristic of an individual. For example, their hair color or their blood type. Some traits are controlled by genes that pass from parent to child. Others are acquired through learning. But most are influenced by a combination of genes and environmental factors. I have listed some examples of variable traits that are ea sy to observe.

Hitch hiker's thumb-It is a thumb that is very flexible, and able to bend backward beyond the normal range of motion. This is because of the genetic traits that make a person bend his thumb backward while stretching.

Thumb

Earlobe attachment-If earlobes hang free, they are detached. If they connect directly to the sides of the head, they are attached. Earlobe attachment is a continuous trait: while most earlobes can be neatly categorized as attached or unattached, some are in-between.
