


HOLIDAY ASSIGNMENT CLASS VIII SESSION: 2021-2022

Dear students

Rabindranath Tagore, the Bard of Bengal believed that freedom of the individual is the basis for the growth of human civilisation and progress. It is the inner urge of a person to be in harmony with the great universe. Freedom is everything creative and spontaneous in human mind and spirit. It is the capacity to create a better order.

The Parrot's Tale, a short story by Tagore brings out the freedom of thought and expression. Tagore believed that each individual must be responsible and be provided with the freedom of thought to think and learn from experiences and discussions.

These are the values of Tagore that we would like you to imbibe and use them to enhance your creative, analytical and organizational skills through the tasks that have been designed for you.

So, this summer vacation, wear your thinking caps, delve deep into the story mentioned, do the activities and enjoy your time with your family and friends. Over and above, stay indoors, stay safe.

General Instructions for the activities:

There are five activities given to you. All five activities are compulsory.

- a) Your work should be well researched, presented and visually attractive.
- b) Upload your work in the respective Google classrooms.
- c) Each task will be assessed under the following parameters:
 - Relevance of the content
 - Expression of the ideas
 - Presentation
 - Research
 - Creativity

Activity-1

Radio Talk Show

The Parrot's Tale reflects the faulty education system in India during Tagore's time or perhaps is more relevant to the system of education that restricts the holistic development of a child, rather deprives one of all innocent joys in life.

- Keeping the theme of the story in mind, imagine yourself as the parrot from the story. You are grieved at being caged and forced to learn things that do not interest you. You decide to host a radio talk show to express your woes. Kindly follow the guidelines given:
- You will work in groups of five. The groups will be assigned by your subject teacher.
- Each student in a group must contribute to the show in one or the other way.
- Limit yourself to eight minutes and record your show in an MP3 format and upload the same in the Google classroom.
- Create your show in the form of a parody or a spoof satirising the faulty education system present in the society.
- Invite famous personalities such as Malala Yousafzai, the activist for female education, Kailash Satyarthi, the social reformer who advocated the universal right to education and find out from them as to why is it important to have the right to freedom of thought and expression and the right to educate oneself.

 You can create a jingle mocking the system, include music, and add a background score to make the show interesting.

Activity-2

Activity-3

Math and Art - Lifeline to true freedom

Rabindranath Tagore, a moulder of independent India's intellectual inheritance, strongly supported and encouraged the freedom of expression. Now that you have read the captivating story, feel free to express your thoughts by creating your own unique and innovative artwork. This will not only enhance your spatial reasoning skills but will also make you a Math wizard in the true sense as the English mathematician, G.H Hardy once said, "A mathematician, like a painter or a poet, is a maker of patterns".

- A. Choose a scene or a character from the story, The Parrot Tales that appealed to you the most.
- Use polygons, lines, curves, patterns and as many geometrical shapes as you wish for illustrating your chosen scene or character.
- Explore and research the Alpana (Alpana) art form and incorporate its elements in your artwork. Is there any other art form that is drawn using geometrical shapes (triangles, lines etc.)? Feel free to use its components as well in your masterpiece.

("The sky is filled with sun and stars. Life spreads in the entire Universe. I secure my place among them.")

The Parrot's Tale, a thought of Tagore, can be extended universally to all fields/ disciplines of education including Science. His childhood experience of sky-viewing and planetary configurations with his father at night, while holidaying at the Dalhousie Hills led him to write Vishwa Parichay (Introduction to the Universe) where he blended his literary prowess with scientific facts and figures to make them interesting for the readers.

Task: To design a digital poster

Imagine yourself along with your friend in the milky way galaxy taking a tour of the various planets. During the journey, you interact with the planets to find out more about their unique characteristics, such as the existence of life on Earth, spectacular rings of Saturn etc.

The powerlessness of Indians to determine their own future without the consent of the British led to the national independence movement.
