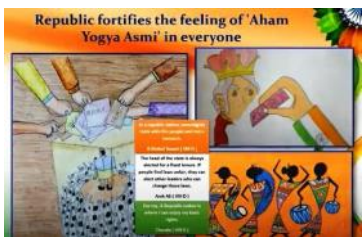

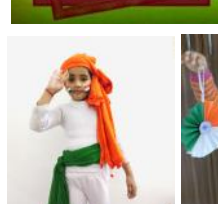
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# Republic Day

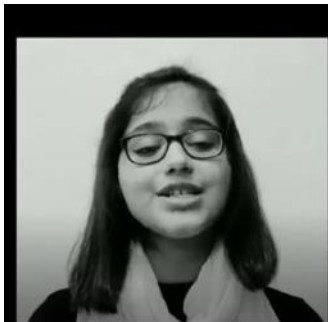

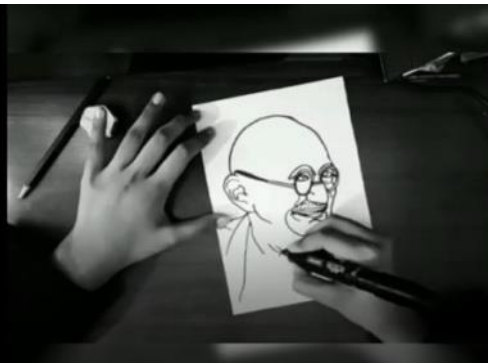

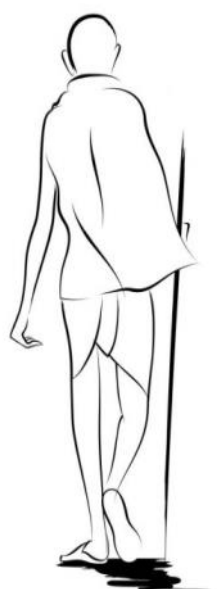

# Sports Day

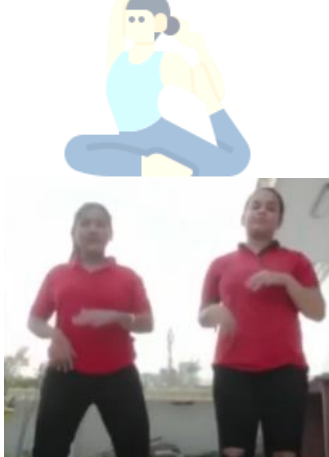

# Sr. Prize Distribution

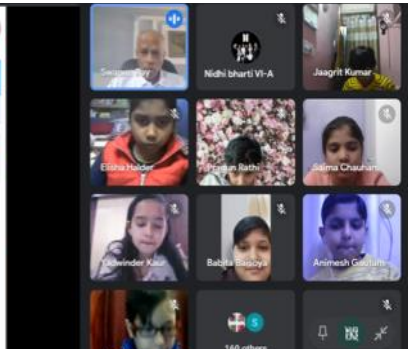

The theme for the year 2021-22 Rabindranath Tagore, the great Bard of Bengal, was entwined with the art forms hence the students of primary classes showcased the theatrical presentation of the stories written by Tagore with the Rabindra music, dance performances.

The students of class I depicted the famous 'Parrot's tale'. As the story focuses on the demerits of mechanical learning it also calls attention to the need to cultivate childrens' minds.

The students of class II recorded the musical play 'Feast for the rats'.

A modern version of the story Kabuliwala was presented by class III students. The story of Mini whose childhood revolved around her best friend Kabuliwalla was recorded with a modern twist. As she started going to a hostel for her schooling, the Kabuliwala shifted his business to online e-commerce. The story was twitched to adjust to the present times and represented the contemporary challenges and lifestyle of the classical characters.

Class IV represented the classical characters in the modern times representing the challenges dealt with in the present times. The presentation was a rendezvous of various popular characters from the stories written by Tagore.

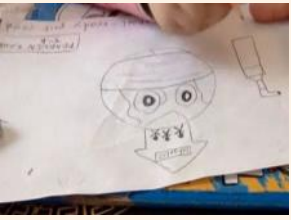
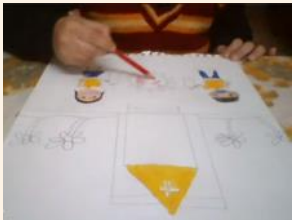

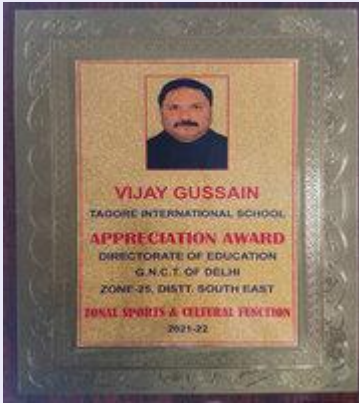

# Workshops for Teachers

## Session on Understanding and Empathising with special needs children (29.03.2022 & 30.03.2022 )

The session was conducted by Ms. Arti Anand and Ms. Shriya Khanna. Conducted in two segments; the first segment was for the Junior School teachers and the second segment was planned for middle and senior school teachers. The focus of the workshop was the inclusion of children with special needs in the classroom with the other children. To enable this integration it is very vital that the teacher is sensitized to the learning, social and physical needs of the students.

The session emphasized on effective and myriad ways to conquer the difficulties faced by teachers to ameliorate the learning of differently abled students within inclusive education in a classroom environment. The key areas addressed were Speech and language Delay, Learning Disability, Depression, ADHD and Autism. To make the teachers more empathetic towards differently abled children activities were conducted.



## Session on Experiential Learning and Pedagogues (23.03.2022 and 30-03-2022

A session on Experiential Learning was conducted on Wednesday, 23 March 2022 in Tagore International School, East of Kailash which was attended by teachers teaching grades Nursery to class VIII. The objective of the session was to share an enriching experience of creating activities for students to make learning a joyful experience and provide hands on to develop life skills.
