

World Heritage Day

World Heritage Day, also known as the International Day of Monuments and Sites, is celebrated every year on the 18 of April. The given theme for 2022 was COMPLEX PAST DIVERSE FUTURE. To commemorate this day, groups of students of Classes VI to X and Class XII created Brochures or Historical guide pages (columns and blocks like a newspaper) on chart paper on a specific heritage site. The facts to include were the history of the site, the relevant dates, significance of the monument and ways of conservation of these monuments.

Class VI completed the activity on the Ancient Period sites of Acropolis of Athens, Pyramids of Egypt, Great Wall of China and the Roman Colosseum. The activity for Class VII was monuments on the Medieval Period like the Konark Temple, Jamali Kamali, Tughlaqabad Fort and the Golden Temple. Class VIII worked on the Ancient Universities of Nalanda, Takshashila, Vikramshila and Somapura. Class IX completed their activity on the Ancient Sites of Machu Picchu, Angorrat (Cambodia), Stonehenge (England) and Bagan (Myanmar). Class X worked on Medieval European Monuments such as Heidelberg Castle (Germany), Dubrovnik (Croatia), City of La Grasse (France) and Westminster Abbey (London). The topics for Class XII A were the Ellora caves, Tomb of Bakhtiyar Kaki, Fatehpur Sikri, Fort William, Hampi and Khajuraho. The students enjoyed the activity, showed enthusiasm and willingness to work and were contented working in their respective groups.



Earth Day Celebrations


THEME: : Invest in Our Planet

The themes for classes I-V was Life below Water and Quality Education, for classes VI-VIII it was Life on Land and Clean Water, and Sanitation, and that for classes IX-XII was Climate Action and Peace, Justice, and Strong Institutions. The school auditorium reverberated with the beautiful melodies sung by the students and exceptional instrumental and band performances. The program was concluded with a speech by the school's senior headmistress, Ms. Debjani Mitra.



Book Week

Book Week is all about celebrating books as well as authors and illustrators. It's a fantastic week and great to see young learners getting excited about books!

The school organised Book week with great zest and zeal in the first week of May for classes VI-VIII. The students whole-heartedly and excitedly took part in this fun-filled and intriguing event, more so as they could physically interact with their peers after a gap of almost two years.

The students read different stories from the given choices of authors and series, such as Piemme Edizioni Geronimo Stilton, Thea Stilton books, Jeff Kinney's Diary of a Wimpy Kid series, Ruskin Bond's Children's Omnibus, Liz Pichon's Tom Gates Series, Roald Dahl's Charlie and the Chocolate Factory, B F G, Rabindra Nath Tagore's The Parrot's Training, Kabuliwala; R.K.Narayan's Malgudi Days, Swami and His Friends, Rick Riordan's Percy Jackson Series and the very famous J.K. Rowling's Harry Potter Series.

They were encouraged to use the school's online library, available on the school website, as the resource for the same.

There were also class discussions conducted wherein the students talked about the books that they have read, highlighting characters and events that they particularly liked and students got the opportunity to share their valuable inputs.

Putting on their creative caps, they chose to make any one out of story sticks, story stones, coffee cup/ glass, pocket cards, badges, paper neck tie, face mask, eye mask and paper bag, which contained a quote, a character sketch, portrait of their favourite protagonist; or even a famous dialogue; all based on the stories they have read!

They grabbed this opportunity to be creative and imaginative and presented their 'work of art' with a brief presentation.

As children engaged with this set up, it was wonderful to see them using their knowledge from the books transform into a creative work of craft.

The week culminated with a tour to the Scholastic Book Fair set up in the nursery foyer for the young minds to further explore the world of books, and take a dive into the world of magic and unending knowledge. It was indeed an enriching experience for the students and the teachers alike as it reiterated the importance of reading books in one's life.












To celebrate the birth anniversary of one of the most loved and influential poets of all time Rabindranath Tagore, a splendid celebration is organized by the school every year.






Students of Photography Club and Polaroid Club were taken for a heritage walk to Safdarjung Tomb on Tuesday, 10 May 2022.


