Remembering the Heroes Kargil Vijay Diwas



INTER HOUSE KISSA GOYI COMPETITION (VI-VIII)



Workshops for students

Career in Management by Dr. Ravinder Kumar for classes X to XII (4/07/2020)

The resource person for the session was Dr. Ravinder Kumar, Dean, Dept. of Commerce and Business Studies, Jamia Millia Islamia and Member of International Leadership Association, University of Maryland, USA . Dr. Kumar provided an insight into various courses available in the field of business management and he guided students about the admission process of various universities like Delhi University, Jamia Milia Islamia. He also discussed the scope of the management courses during the COVID era and in the post COVID scenario. Students utilized this opportunity to clarify all their doubts about the management industry.



Session on Liberal Arts for classes XI & XII (18.07.2020)

The resource person for the session was Ms. Parneet Gill, the Assistant Director with the Outreach team, Ashoka University. The speaker for the session was Ms. Parul, Manager Outreach, Ashoka University. Students were informed about the successful people worldwide who decided to choose liberal education as a career path.

She highlighted the fact that liberal education offers a broad knowledge of the wider world (e.g. science, culture, and society) as well as in-depth study in a specific area of interest. He further added that a company secretary plays a vital role in company's future and coordinates the management functions and company policies. The students were informed that the role/

scope of a company secretary has increased many folds under the new Companies Act, 2013, particularly after being given the position of a Key Managerial Personnel (KMP).




A session on 'Career in Armed Forces' by Major General Samir Kumar Chakravorty for classes XI & XII on 08/08/2020
