









November 26 is observed as Constitution Day or 'Samvidhan Diwas' every year, which commemorates the adoption of the Constitution of India. On November 26, 1949, the Constitution was adopted and it came into effect on January 26, 1950. The purpose behind celebrating Constitution Day is to promote the values of the Constitution among the youth of the country. As Dr. Bhimrao Ambedkar, the first law minister of India, had the most prominent role in the making of the legal document outlining rights and laws concerning Indian citizens, the celebration can also be seen as paying tribute to his legacy. A plethora of activities were conducted by all classes to commemorate the day.









Human Rights Day is observed every year on 10 December — the day the United Nations General Assembly adopted, in 1948, the Universal Declaration of Human Rights. The theme adopted this year: EQUALITY -Reducing inequalities, advancing human rights.

As part of the celebrations of the International Human Rights Day, Tagore International School, East of Kailash conducted various activities for the students from different grades.

Students of class VI to VIII were shown a video regarding Human Rights and importance of coming together and working towards achieving the common goal of reducing inequality. Students participated in discussion about their understanding of Human rights and why they felt it is important that every human has basic rights. They also discussed about the issue of lack of awareness among the illiterate and poor about their basic rights and how they are repressed by the powerful people. They were asked to share steps they can take to reduce the inequalities that have increased due to Covid-19.

Class IX discussed the differences between human rights and fundamental rights after watching the video of UNHCR Commissioner. Rights proclaimed in the Universal Declaration of Human Rights were read by students in the session followed by a brainstorming session where students were encouraged to ponder and share their views/ opinion on the following:

- What are human rights? Why should anyone respect them?
- Why do some groups require special human rights? Does this mean that they have more rights than others?
- Why do we talk about human rights and not human responsibilities?
- Is violation of human rights only a problem in non-democratic countries?

Students of class XI participated in the activity with enthusiasm. The students were shown a film on the address of Michelle Bachelet, the High Commissioner of Human Rights, United Nations. The students had also prepared themselves for a discussion on Human Rights violations. A vibrant debate ensued in the class on the importance of Human Rights. The UN Charter on the Universal Declaration of Human rights was also read out.



National Mathematics Day



The main objective behind celebrating the day is to raise awareness among the students about the importance of mathematics for the development of humanity.

In our school, the students from class I to XII actively participated to celebrate the event. Various fun-filled activities based on Critical thinking, logical reasoning and visual thinking were organized to honour the subject of Mathematics and the life of this Math genius.

You tube videos, depicting the landmark achievements, struggles and contributions of the great mathematician were shown and were followed by a brief discussion.



Students were introduced to new games like 2048 in class VIII and Str8ts in class VII while class VI learnt the tricks for Mobius Strip. Students of class X were challenged to solve "KENKEN", a grid-based numerical puzzle






MATH NINJAS




Children participated with enthusiasm as they made some very innovative and creative toys.





Achievements

The first stage regional selection round of tGELF/JA India LEAD Company of the Year Competition 2021 was held in October, For the competition, two teams had registered from our school. Two workshops for the same, one on Cost Management, Fundraising and Cash Flow and the other on Product Ideation and Design were held. These were organised to enhance the knowledge of students in these areas under the guidance of mentors from different backgrounds. The four board members of the company Ishita Verma, Sejal Jain, Shradha Sabharwal and Vidhi Chaudhary, all from class XII-B, presented their idea in front of the panel of judges.
